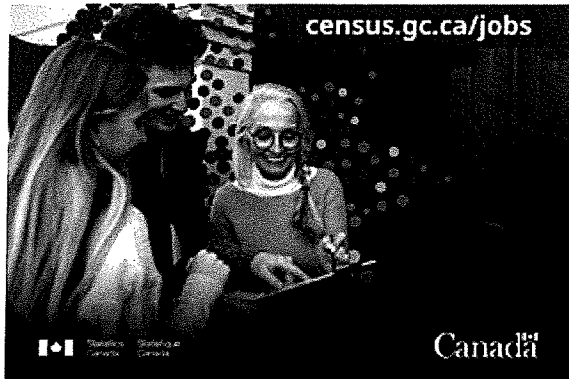

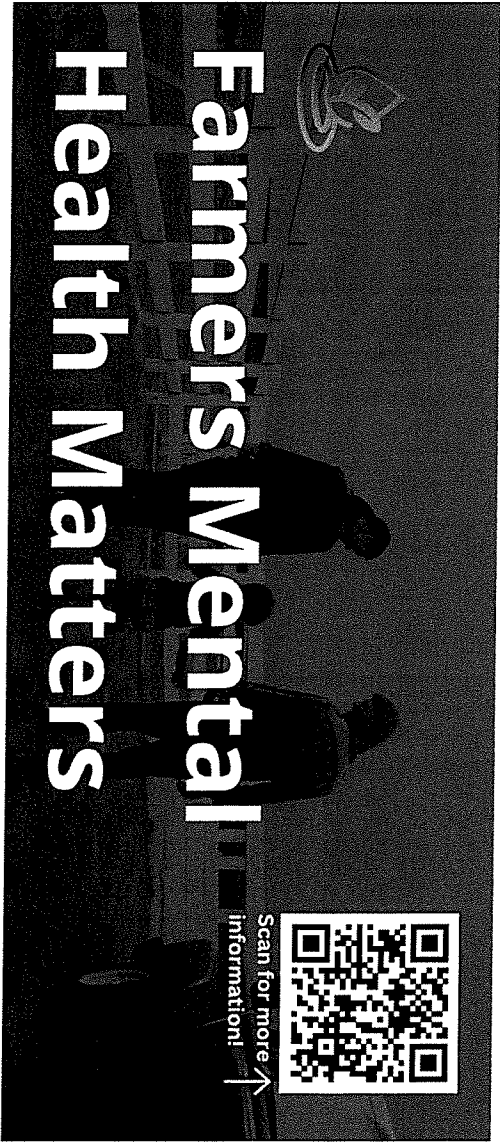

Waskada School Playground Upgrades

Waskada School Parent Advisory Council (PAC) is excited to announce we are in the planning stages of expanding our playground area. Community recreation will be expanded by adding a durable, multi-use hard-surface court and a disc swing near the existing playground. The new court, constructed with pour-in-place rubber, will support basketball, tennis, and pickleball, with clear markings and safety features designed for all ages. The hard surface will support wheelchair and mobility-aid use, which is important for our school as we have a child in nursery school and beginning kindergarten in 2027 that requires walker/wheelchair access. The disc swing will provide inclusive, active play opportunities for younger children and families. The project is intended to create a welcoming, shared space that encourages physical activity, social interaction, and family use. Community members of all ages will be able to use the space for organized games, informal play, school programs, and after-school activities.

To date we have received the following grants/pledges:

Our quote for the multi-use hard-surface court and a disc swing near the existing playground was \$113,898.00. We will be requesting an updated quote to have a hard-surface pathway from the school to the playground added so the student requiring walker/wheelchair access can independently get to and from the school and the playground. Our hope is to begin construction of the new playground area summer 2026 and to have it completed by the fall but funds will determine this timeline.

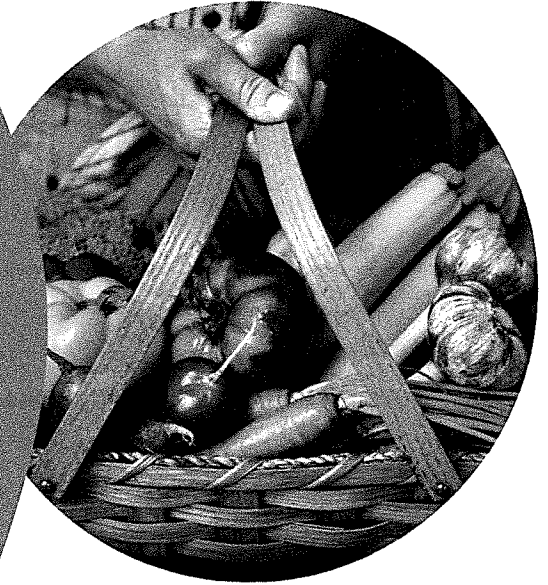

in Brandon, Treaty Two, MB and a lecturer in Art

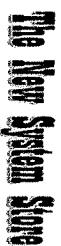
History at Brandon University. Before re-locating

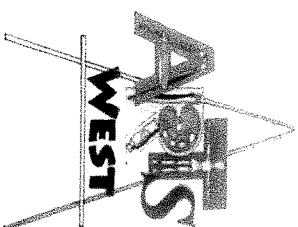

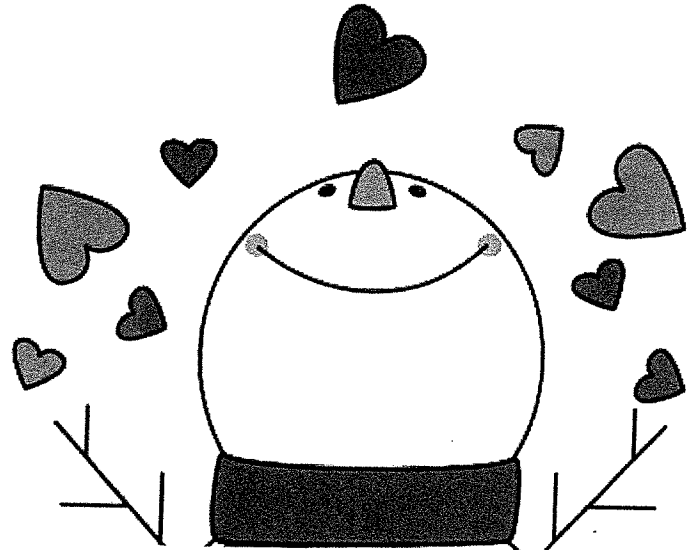

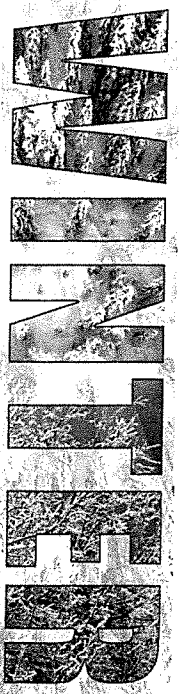
